Housing requirements include being a resident of Perry County AND actively working a recovery program in Aftercare and Relapse Prevention.

**ClearView WITHDRAWAL MANAGEMENT CENTER** – 511 N. Main Street, New Lexington. Phone: 740-343-6130. – Provides adults 18 and older with withdrawal management from Alcohol, Opiates, Benzodiazepines, Methamphetamines, and Methadone. Clients have access to nursing services, counseling, and case management throughout their stay.
